- The students admitted in a specific admission process may enroll within their own new enrollment dates. Their enrollment may not be postponed or carried over to another admission process.
- If available spaces for a program are fully filled, next admission process results will not be announced.
- 1st and 2nd Admission Processes will be executed for all programs; the 3rd Admission Process will only take place for programs with Thesis.
- French Language Education, English Language Education, Labor Economics and Industrial Relations, Public Relations and Advertising, Art History, Sociology, History doctorate programs require 'Written and Oral Scientific Evaluation Exam' and both master and proficiency in arts programs in Fine Arts require 'Talent Exam.' The list of candidates eligible to take the exam and the exam dates will be announced on the website of Graduate School on the first workday following the end of each application period.

### **APPLICATION METHOD:**

- 1- International candidates will apply on 1 July 30 August 2024 at the address "basvuruyld.anadolu.edu.tr" of Anadolu University.
- 2- In order to be able to apply, candidates need to register to the system only once using the "Sign Up" link. After that, the candidates will identify themselves by logging in with their Foreign ID Number/Passport Number; and will be guided by the system to complete their application.
- 3- For each program, there are two different types of available spaces, T.R. and international. Therefore, candidates should choose the appropriate program in order to apply to the desired availability. For example; for the Primary Education Program, candidates must select the Primary Education (International Students) section to apply for international availability. Applications made outside of the own nationality will be considered invalid.
- **4-** In any case, it is possible to apply to two different programs at the Graduate School, provided that the registration is done for only one program. However, only one application is possible for Distance Education Master's Programs (Non-Thesis).
- 5- The applications of candidates who misrepresented their information during the application, even if they are eligible for registration, will be canceled.
- **6-** The result of the applications will be announced in **the announcement section of the web address of the Graduate School**. The candidates will be registered on the condition that they submit the documents uploaded during the application to the address of the graduate school to prove the information they stated during the application.
- 7- Applications will be evaluated by the Office for International Affairs.

## **APPLICATION AND PLACEMENT:**

- 1- Graduate program applications will be evaluated based on General Grade Point Average (excluding Fine Arts programs). In the ranking of success, "General Grade Point Averages" will be evaluated out of hundred. The student must enter a score out of a hundred if the student's education system is based on hundred, and a score out of four if the system is based on four. A student who has a transcript in both a hundred-and-four-point system must enter the "General Grade Point Average" in the four-point system. For those students whose "General grade point average" is calculated according to a different base, "General grade point average" out of a hundred will be calculated by Anadolu University according to the relevant Senate decision which can be reached at https://www.anadolu.edu.tr/ogrenci-isleri/orgun -bilgi-ve-belgeler/senato-ve-yonetim-kurulu-kararlari/yabanci-universiteleri-not-karsiliklar. Ranking of success in evaluation will be from the highest score to the lowest score. In the case of equality of points, the candidate with the highest grade of the bachelor's diploma will be given priority, and in case these are equal as well, the candidate with the lower age will be given priority.
- 2- At least sixty points must be obtained from the aptitude test for applications to the master's degree and art proficiency program of the Fine Arts. Examinations for majors at programs in Fine Arts are conducted as portfolio review and/or artistic work, and interviews. Further information about the time and format of the artistic work exams can be obtained from the directorate of the department. Achievement score of students in fine arts majors is calculated by taking forty percent of the average of the bachelor's and sixty percent of the "Talent Test" result. At least sixty points out of a hundred are required to be considered successful in the "Talent Test".

- 3- Candidates are required to document their foreign language score in order to be able to register for doctorate/art proficiency programs and master's degree programs taught in foreign languages.
  - a. In order to start the Ph.D./art proficiency program, candidates must obtain at least fifty-five points from the foreign language exams organized by the Assessment, Selection and Placement Center (ÖSYM) or an equivalent score from international foreign language exams whose equivalence is accepted by ÖSYM.
  - b. In order to be able to register for graduate programs in which the language of instruction is a foreign language (except for foreign language programs), candidates must obtain at least sixty points from the foreign language exams organized by ÖSYM in the foreign language they will study or an equivalent score from international foreign language exams accepted as equivalent by ÖSYM.
  - c. Candidates applying to master's and doctorate degrees whose fields of discipline are foreign languages must have a score of at least eighty in the foreign language they will study or an equivalent score from international foreign language exams whose equivalence is accepted by ÖSYM.
- 4- In order for international candidates, accepted to programs whose language of instruction is Turkish, to start the program; as Türkçe Öğretim Merkezi (TÖMER) and European Language Portfolio (ELP) level equivalent; they must either provide documents that certify that they have received a score at the (C1) level or score at least seventy out of a hundred points from the "Turkish Proficiency Exam" to be held by Anadolu TÖMER. Foreign nationals who have graduated from undergraduate programs in which the language of instruction is Turkish are considered sufficient. Candidates who are accepted to the program but cannot achieve Turkish language proficiency receive Turkish education at Anadolu TÖMER in accordance with the Principles of International Student Admission to Anadolu University Graduate Programs accepted by the Anadolu University Senate.

### **DOCUMENTS TO UPLOAD TO APPLICATION:**

- 1. The original and notarized Turkish translations of the bachelor's degree "graduation documents" (transcript) translated by a sworn translator for candidates who apply to master's programs and post-bachelor's doctorate/proficiency in arts programs; the original and notarized Turkish translations of the master's degree "graduation documents" (transcript) translated by a sworn translator for candidates applying to post-master's doctorate/proficiency in arts program.
- 2. The original of the bachelor's degree diploma or graduation certificate and its notarized Turkish translations translated by a sworn translator for candidates who apply to the master's program and to post-bachelor's doctorate/proficiency in arts program; the original of the master's diploma or graduation certificate and its notarized Turkish translations translated by a sworn translator for applicants to a post-graduate doctorate/proficiency in arts program.
- 3. Turkish Proficiency Certificate (if any) for applications to programs whose language of education is Turkish.
- 4. Foreign language exam result document for applications to doctorate/proficiency in art programs and master's programs taught in a foreign language.
- 5. Photograph.
- 6. Copy of Passport.

## **ENROLLMENT PROCESS:**

- 1. Candidates who are accepted to be enrolled will receive their Acceptance Letters themselves by logging into the system at "basvuruyld.anadolu.edu.tr"; and they will be asked to register on registration dates. Candidates are required to follow the information about the registrations on the graduate school web page. Registrations will be checked and approved by the Student Affairs of the Graduate School. The approval process should be followed at "basvuruyld.anadolu.edu.tr." Colored photocopies of the documents and their notarized Turkish translations translated by a sworn translator must be submitted to the Graduate School Registrar's Office by the end of the add-drop week. The registrations of the ones who do not carry out the submission will be deleted.
- 2. Candidates with missing/false declarations of documents required for registration will not be registered. The registration of students who are found to have made false statements after registration will be cancelled.
- 3. After registration, information on "school recognition" will be requested from the Higher Education Council regarding graduation certificates received from abroad; the registrations of those whose university of graduation is not recognized by the Higher Education Board will be cancelled.
- 4. Students who complete their registration to the program must choose the courses they will take between the dates of **September 30- October 4, 2024** (or add-drop dates October 7-11, 2024); and have it approved by the registration advisor. Otherwise, it will be considered as not registered due to incomplete transactions.
